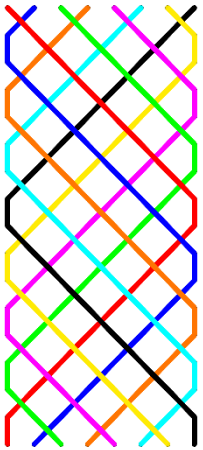


Plain Hunt Major



Purpose

A progression from ringing Plain Bob Triples, Plain Bob Major is rung on eight bells.

As major methods are usually rung uncovered (without a tenor ringing behind), bells coming to the lead will not have a covering bell to use as a reference point when leading.

Being able to plain hunt steadily on eight bells is a useful stepping stone to ringing popular methods such as Plain Bob Major.



Just like Plain Bob Minor, bells leave the back at handstroke.

Odd numbered bells start by hunting up to the back, whilst even numbered bells start by hunting down to the lead.

Tip

Because there are more bells ringing, the gaps between the bells are smaller than they are on doubles or minor.
