

Candlesby Treble Place Doubles

Purpose

Candlesby is a doubles method, where the ringer of the 2 rings the slow course bell, making alternate second and third places after each lead. This can provide a stepping stone towards Plain Hunt and there are clear treble sign posts.

Ringing Candlesby Treble Place Doubles

The treble plain hunts.

Second place bell rings the slow course work in 1-3:

- Lead full
- Hunt to thirds place
- Make thirds (2 blows)
- Hunt down to the lead
- Lead full
- Make seconds over the treble
- Repeat

If the treble takes you off lead, make seconds and lead again. If any other bell except the treble takes you off lead, make thirds. The pattern is alternating seconds and thirds.

The 3, 4 and 5:

- If the treble turns you from the back, make two blows under the treble in fourth place and lie behind before dodging 3-4 down.
- If your bell passes the treble in 2-3, dodge 3-4 up.
- If your bell passes the treble in 3-4, make long fifths (four blows)
