

Slapton Slow Bob Doubles



Purpose

Slapton is a simple doubles method, where the ringer of the 2 rings a pattern of places in 1-2. There are clear treble signposts and an opportunity to focus on striking when moving and out of the lead.

If the ringers of the working bells are familiar with St Martin's or St Simon's doubles, the back work will be quite familiar.

Ringing Slapton Bob Doubles

The treble plain hunts.

Second place bell rings the slow course work in 1-2:

- Lead
- Make long seconds (4 blows)
- Lead
- Make two blows over the treble.

The 3, 4 and 5 ring the method:

- Four blows in lead under the slow course bell.
- If your bell passes the treble in 2-3, dodge 3-4 up and make two blows in fifths, then two in thirds.
- If your bell passes the treble in in 3-4, make long fifths, then two in thirds.
- If you pass the treble in fifth place, dodge 3-4 down and hunt to lead.
