

Bastow Minimus

Purpose

Bastow Minimus is a short method that can be rung at a practice when there are fewer ringers.

If the treble ringer is already confident with making places with another bell, this is a small progression to making places over a different bell each time. They will only have three different bells to look out for.

Learning to spot different bells coming into the lead may help to develop ropesight.

The inside bells dodge 3-4 up and 3-4 down.

If there is a tenor ringer, they will be ringing over only three different bells.

Ringling Bastow Minimus

The treble makes places in 1-2.

Bells 2, 3 and 4 plain hunt, dodging 3-4 up and 3-4 down.
