

Plain Hunt Triples



Purpose

A progression to ringing on a higher number of bells, Plain Hunt Triples (7 bells) is usually rung with a tenor ringing behind, so bells coming into lead will have the reassuring rhythm of a tenor to reference when leading.

Being able to plain hunt steadily on seven bells is a useful stepping stone towards ringing popular methods like Grandsire Triples or Plain Bob Triples.

Just like Plain Bob Doubles, bells leave the back at backstroke.



As with Plain Hunt Doubles, odd numbered bells start by hunting up to the back, whilst even numbered bells start by hunting down to the lead. The last bell (the 7) makes a place and then hunts in.

Tip

Because there are more bells ringing, the gaps between the bells are smaller than they are on doubles or minor.
