

Plain Bob Doubles - plain course



Purpose


Plain Bob Doubles is a widely rung doubles method. It is based on plain hunt, but the working bells ring one of four pieces of work every time the treble leads.

There are clear treble signposts.

Ringing Plain Bob Doubles

The treble plain hunts.

The working bells ring a cycle of work – making seconds, dodging 3-4 down, making long fifths and dodging 3-4 up.




Each of these four pieces of work are done when the treble leads.

Treble signposts

- If the treble takes your bell off the lead, make seconds and lead again.
- If you pass the treble in 4-5, dodge 3-4 down.
- If you pass the treble in 3-4, make long fifths.
- If you pass the treble in 2-3, dodge 3-4 up.



The work of the 3 (place bells are marked)



Tip: in the plain course, either the treble or one other bell will take you off the lead. This is your after bell. If you are ringing the 3 this will always be the 2.
